Praying the Rosary

The Rosary is a meditative prayer that reflects upon the life, ministry, and death of Jesus and also on His Blessed Mother. As we repeat the familiar prayers, we allow our minds to think about the lives of Jesus and Mary here on earth – a mystery. This resource was created to be used in the classroom, but you may wish to use it to help you pray the Rosary at home with your child(ren).

The Mysteries

There are four parts to the rosary, known as ‘mysteries’:

- The Luminous Mysteries
- The Sorrowful Mysteries
- The Glorious Mysteries
- The Joyful Mysteries

For each set of mysteries, we are introduced to five different elements or ‘snapshots’ of the lives of Jesus and Mary. Each snapshot taken from Scripture is an opportunity to reflect and pray. To respond, we pray a set of prayers, which together with the reflection is called a ‘decade’. The prayers we say as part of this set begin with one **Our Father**, followed by **ten Hail Marys** and one **Glory Be** to finish. We use the beads of the Rosary to keep track of our prayers!

Choose one set of ‘snapshots’ from Scripture on the following pages to reflect upon as you pray the ‘Our Father’, then the ten ‘Hail Marys’ and then the ‘Glory Be’.

Many people use rosary beads to help them remember how many prayers to say. We can just use our fingers to count. The Rosary beads contain all the ‘snapshots’ of Scripture, but we will just do one decade in each prayer session.

Remember, this is not a race, it is a form of medative prayer. Say the prayers together, but slowly and thoughtfully.

Joyful Mysteries (Mondays and Saturdays)

As we pray the Hail Mary over and over again, we think about happy times in Mary's life. We call these the Joyful Mysteries.

The angel Gabriel asks Mary to be the Mother of Jesus.



The Visitation
Mary visits her cousin Elizabeth. Elizabeth's baby (St. John the Baptist) recognizes Mary's Baby (Jesus) in the womb!

The Nativity
Mary gives birth to Jesus in a manger.



The Presentation
Mary and Joseph take Jesus to the Temple, and Simeon and Anna recognize Jesus as the Messiah.

The Finding in the Temple
Mary and Joseph fear Jesus is lost. They find Him teaching in the Temple.

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Hail Mary

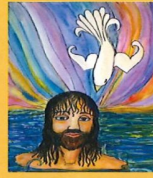
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Amen.

As we pray our Hail Marys, we think about times in Jesus' life. We call these the Luminous Mysteries. Luminous means light. Light helps us to understand.



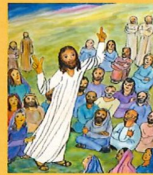
The Baptism of Jesus

Jesus is baptized by John the Baptist in the Jordan River.



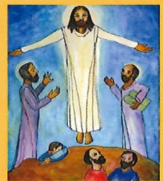
The Wedding at Cana

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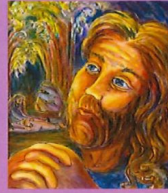

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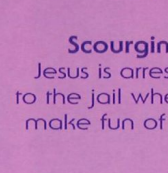
Sorrowful Mysteries (Tuesdays and Fridays)

Jesus prays in the Garden of Gethsemane, but His disciples fall asleep.



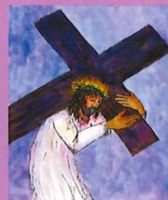
The Scouring at the Pillar

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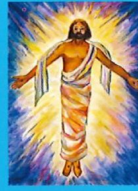
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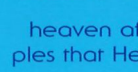
Glorious Mysteries

(Wednesdays and Sundays)

As we pray the Hail Marys, we think about the wonderful times in Jesus' life and in Mary's life after the crucifixion. We call these the Glorious Mysteries.



👑 **The Resurrection**
Jesus rises from the dead.



👑 **The Ascension**
Jesus ascends to heaven after telling His disciples that He will be with them in Spirit forever.



👑 **The Descent of the Holy Spirit**
The Holy Spirit comes as a wonderful gift from Jesus to reach our hearts and minds about God.

👑 **The Assumption**
Mary is taken up into heaven, body and soul.



👑 **The Coronation**
God gives Mary a special place in heaven, crowning her as Queen of Heaven and Earth.
